




It's nice to see you!

The Bauhaus was founded in 1919 – over 100 years ago. It was a time when everything was changing quickly. That's why there were many ideas for the "new people" of the future.






What's important to your new human being? Mark 2 things that you like!

Students were taught to explore the world with all their senses - also by moving and dancing!




Can you make these shapes with your body? Use your arms and legs and become a shape!






Where are the toys hidden in the picture above?

Draw a cool costume for your own play. Try to use only simple shapes like triangles, circles or squares.






Here we find many different things created by Bauhaus students. Look for them in the big display case!

Later it moved to Dessau and then Berlin. Finally, it was shut down because it was too modern for Germany's new government. Many Bauhaus students and teachers moved abroad and took their ideas with them.
