#### Goethe and Classical Weimar

The exhibition "Flood of Life – Storm of Deeds" illustrates Goethe's continued relevance to this day. You should plan on spending at least two hours at the exhibition and tour of the Goethe Residence. The Wittumspalais, the dowager residence of Duchess Anna Amalia, is a secret tip for those who want to experience the lifestyle of 18th-century aristocracy. A walk through the Park on the Ilm will take you to Goethe's first home in Weimar, the Gartenhaus.

### Tour 2

#### Modernism and the Bauhaus in Weimar

Bauhaus Museum Weimar, Museum Neues Weimar, Bauhaus-  
Universität Weimar, Tempelherrenhaus and Haus Am Horn

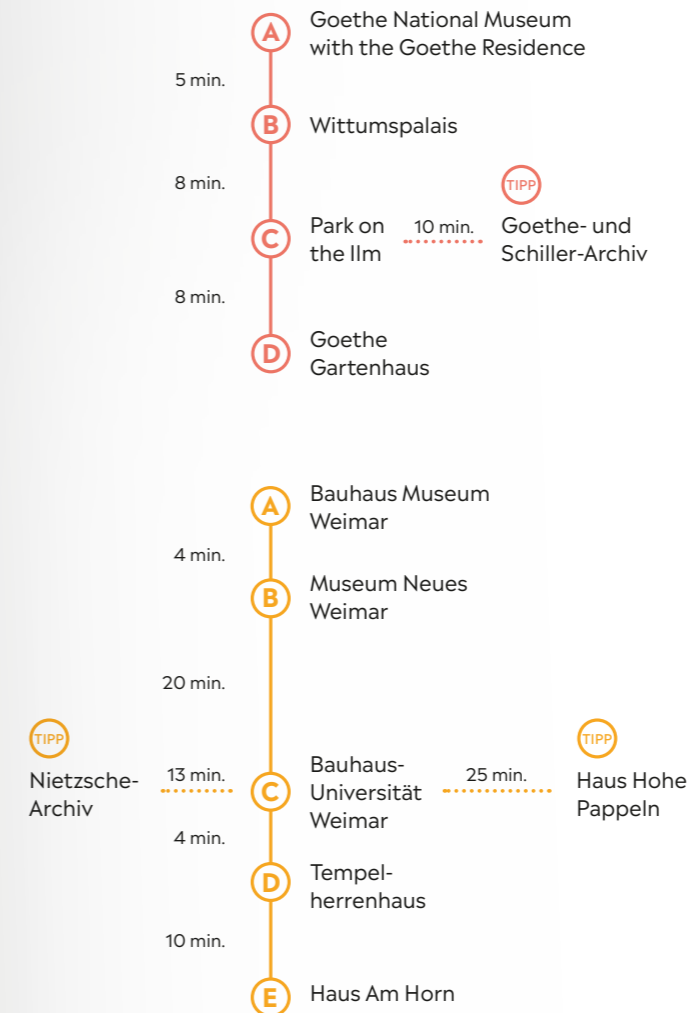
Discover the birthplace of the Bauhaus, the legendary school of design. The Bauhaus Museum Weimar opened its doors in April 2019. The new exhibition at the Museum Neues Weimar highlights the accomplishments of van de Velde, Nietzsche and Co. The main building of the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar, designed by Henry van de Velde, is an impressive example of early 20th-century modernist architecture. On your way to the Haus Am Horn, the only building constructed by the Bauhaus in Weimar, you will pass Johannes Itten's former art studio, the Tempelherrenhaus, situated in the Ilm Park.

# FRIENDS – OR FOES – OF NATURE?

It's a long, complicated relationship that deserves closer inspection.

In 2021 we invite our visitors to do exactly that. You can look forward to an annual programme, highlighting the relationship between humans and nature in science, art, garden art, literature, nutrition and the latest political debates on climate change. In addition to our feature exhibition “I hate nature! Human, Nature, Future” at the Schiller Museum, we will present aspects of this eternally problematic relationship in exhibitions at various venues throughout Weimar.

The historic parks and gardens of the Klassik Stiftung Weimar are the focus of the annual programme “New Nature”. Not only are they UNESCO World Heritage Sites, but also external venues for the German Federal Garden Festival (BUGA) in Erfurt. Numerous events, workshops and interactive tours will transform these natural wonders into spaces of social discourse and presentation as they were originally intended around 1800.

The centrepiece of this transformation will be the “Green Lab”, a temporary pavilion in the Park on the Ilm which will serve as an information centre, event venue and educational workshop. For those who cannot visit the “Green Lab” in person, the “Mobile Green Lab” will come to them to discuss

the future of humans, nature and especially the historic parks. Climate change, vandalism and everyday wear and tear are threatening these garden monuments and their role as public places of rest and relaxation. Both on a local and global scale, humans desperately need to work on their relationship to nature. But by the end of the annual programme, we will have hopefully come up with ways to treat each other better - as new humans and a new nature. »» [www.klassik-stiftung.de/neue-natur](http://www.klassik-stiftung.de/neue-natur)

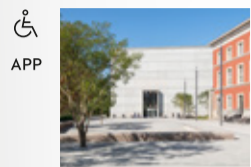
## 1 Bauhaus Museum Weimar

Weimar is the birthplace of the internationally renowned school of art and design. The Bauhaus Museum, completed in April 2019, presents the world's oldest Bauhaus collection and an exhibition on its far-reaching, historical influence.

## 2 Ducal Vault

Historic Cemetery at Poseckscher Garten



Inside the Ducal Vault, visitors can view the caskets of the ducal house of Saxony-Weimar and Eisenach, as well as those of Germany's most famous poets Johann Wolfgang von Goethe and Friedrich von Schiller.

## 3 Goethe Gartenhaus

Park on the Ilm

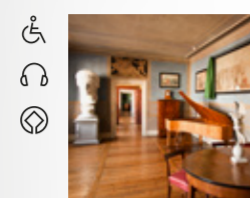


This cottage was Goethe's first residence in Weimar. It contains original pieces of furniture, e.g. the standing desk and stool which Goethe used during various phases of his life. The garden was designed by Goethe himself.

## 4 Goethe National Museum

Goethe Residence and exhibition "Flood of Life - Storm of Deeds"



The historical residence with adjoining garden is the most important site for the presentation and study of Goethe's life and oeuvre. The exhibition "Flood of Life - Storm of Deeds" highlights the achievements and influence of the famous poet, cultural policy maker and art collector.

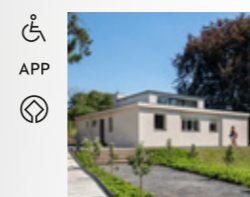


The Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv is the oldest literary archive in Germany. It holds more than 130 estates of renowned writers, scholars, philosophers and composers. Goethe's literary estate was added to the UNESCO "Memory of the World" list in 2001.

## 6 Haus Am Horn

First Bauhaus model house

Am Horn 61

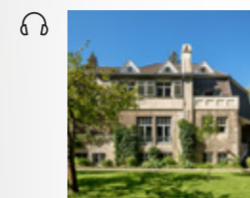


The Haus Am Horn, designed by Georg Muche, was built for the first Bauhaus exhibition in 1923. Today the UNESCO World Heritage Site is regarded as the forerunner of modern living ideas. In May 2019 it reopened after extensive renovation.

## 7 Haus Hohe Pappeln

Residence of Henry van de Velde

Belvederer Allee 58



The architect and designer Henry van de Velde planned every detail of this house for his family. Today you can visit this "Gesamtkunstwerk" of the Jugendstil period with its representative living quarters in the belétage and the surrounding garden.

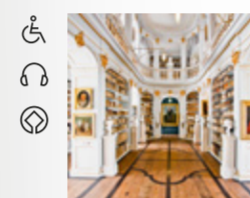

The historic library with its oval, three-storey Rococo Hall is world-famous. The adjoining research library contains important works of literature and cultural history from the Enlightenment to the late Romantic period.

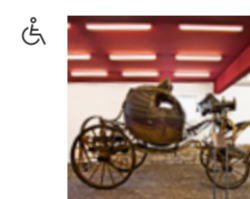


Friedrich Schiller was originally laid to rest in this tomb in 1805. His supposed corpse was transferred to the Ducal Vault in 1826. Researchers have meanwhile determined that the remains in the casket were not those of Schiller.

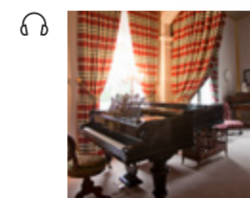

In the former stables of Auerstedt Castle, visitors can view the original carriages used by members of the Ducal and Grand Ducal family of Saxony-Weimar-Eisenach. The collection contains several opulent carriages which were gifted to Weimar's court as part of royal dowries.

## 11 Liszt House

On the upper floor of the court gardener's house, Franz Liszt gave piano lessons to many talented German and foreign pianists. The central salon of the Liszt House, established as a memorial site by Duke Carl Alexander, comprises the living room and workroom with original furnishings and Liszt's Bechstein grand piano.

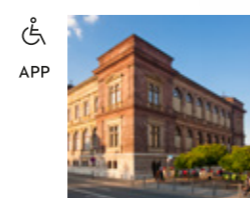

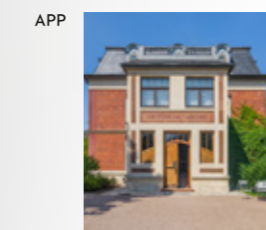


The former Grand Ducal Museum, built in 1869, was one of the first public museums in Germany. In April 2019 the Neues Museum Weimar opened a permanent exhibition on early modernism from the Weimar Painting School to Henry van de Velde.

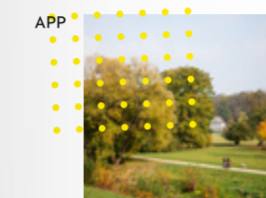
In 1897 an ailing Friedrich Nietzsche moved into the "Villa Silberblick" where he spent the last three years of his life. The interior design and furnishings, added shortly after his death, are among Henry van de Velde's most exquisite creations. Since spring 2020 the Klassik Stiftung Weimar present a newly designed exhibition.

The 58-hectare landscaped park along the Ilm River is Weimar's natural treasure. The design of the park was conceived by Duke Carl August and Goethe between 1778 and 1828. Several lines of sight created centuries ago offer views of the park's most prominent locations.

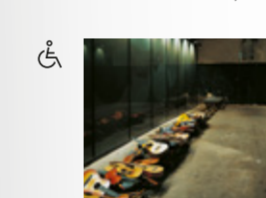
Entrance near the Liszt House Closed for renovation, reopens on 28 Aug 2021



The tunnel system was originally built for storing beer but was expanded as an air-raid shelter during World War II. Today you can take a subterranean journey through 200,000 years of geological and human history.

## 16 Rebecca Horn - "Concert for Buchenwald"

An old tram station at a decommissioned electricity plant recalls a darker time in Weimar's history. The installation "Concert for Buchenwald" by Rebecca Horn is one of the most important contemporary art installations on the Holocaust in Germany.

Inspired by Italy, Duke Carl August had his friend Goethe supervise the construction of the Roman House, which the Duke later used as a retreat. In addition to the beautiful panoramic view of the Park on the Ilm River, an exhibition provides details of how the park was developed.

On the run and using the name "Dr. Ritter", Schiller found refuge here with the Wolzogen family in 1782. Along with an exhibition of documents from Schiller's life and work, the museum presents an authentic late 18th-century atmosphere with numerous pieces of original furniture.

## 19 Schiller Residence

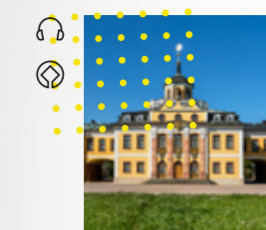

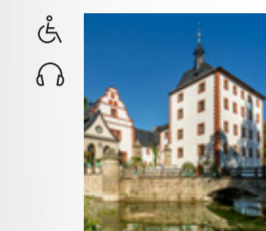

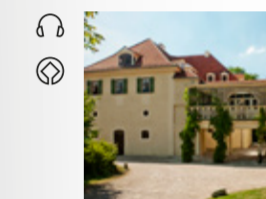


The former country estate of the Von Stein family gained prominence thanks to Goethe's affection for Charlotte von Stein and his frequent visits. Behind the formerly moated castle lies a romantic landscaped park. The unique Liebhabetheater, built around 1800, still operates today.

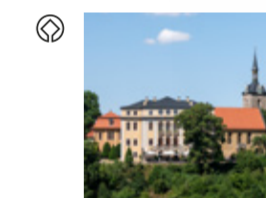

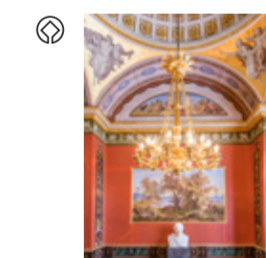
Carl Alexander, great-grandson of Anna Amalia, had this jewel designed on the north slope of the Ettersberg. The glorious panorama, created in 1845 by the so-called "Pücklerschlag", provides a view to the former Baroque hunting castle.

The former ducal residence constituted the cultural heart of Weimar for centuries. Renovation work on the castle will continue until 2030 and will culminate in a new visitor centre and a completely new exhibition.

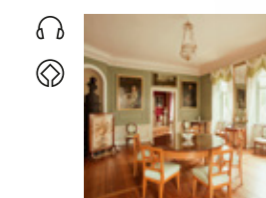

The Baroque mansion with its ornate ceiling murals served as Duchess Anna Amalia's dowager residence. Her famous social events took place in the "Round Table Room". A highlight is the authentic décor of the Green Salon, the Duchess's former parlour.
