Bauhaus Museum Weimar

Stéphane-Hessel-Platz 1



Weimar is the birthplace of the Bauhaus, the internationally renowned school of art and design. The museum presents the world's oldest Bauhaus collection and an exhibition on its far-reaching influence.

Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv

Jenaer Straße 1



The Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv is Germany's oldest literary archive and home to the literary estates of famous poets and philosophers dating back to the 13th century. Temporary exhibitions offer fascinating insights into the collection.

Goethe National Museum

Goethes Residence and exhibition “Flood of Life – Storm of Deeds”

The museum in Weimar is the most important site dedicated to the presentation and study of Goethe's life and works. The historic residence contains an extraordinary trove of original furnishings and collection pieces, while the exhibition highlights the lasting influence of the famous poet, cultural policy-maker and art collector.

Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek

Rococo Hall and exhibition “Cranach's Torrent of Images”
Platz der Demokratie 1



The historic library is not only home to exquisite collections, but also the three-storey Rococo Hall, the Book Tower and the Military Collection. The exhibition “Cranach's Torrent of Images” presents original items from the workshop of Lucas Cranach the Elder and his son in the authentic setting of the Renaissance Hall.

Study Centre

Research library and temporary presentations
Platz der Demokratie 4



The Study Centre contains some 170,000 volumes on open-access shelves, as well as numerous workstations and a reading room. The centrepiece is the modern “Book Cube” featuring temporary presentations which can be viewed at no charge.

Over the years, the Kassengewölbe mausoleum has gradually faded from public memory. Reconstructed in 1927, the mausoleum now commemorates Friedrich Schiller's first burial site.

Museum Neues Weimar

Ways to the Bauhaus

The dawn of a new era: The Museum Neues Weimar conjures the art world of early modernism around 1900. International works of Realism, Impressionism and Art Nouveau, as well as the functional designs of Henry van de Velde reflect a time of splendour and contradiction. A large museum workshop invites visitors to try their hand at traditional arts and crafts.

Park Cave

Through Time and Climate

Entrance near the Liszt House



A special place with an eventful history. Originally excavated for storing beer, the Park Cave was later used by the court as an underground promenade and then expanded as an air raid bunker at the end of World War II. Hidden beneath the Park on the Ilm, this subterranean tunnel system takes visitors on a 200,000-year journey through geological and human history.

Rebecca Horn – “Concert for Buchenwald”

A historic tram depot in the now defunct electricity plant invokes a dark chapter of Weimar's past. The internationally acclaimed installation “Concert for Buchenwald” is one of the most important works on the Holocaust in Germany's contemporary art scene.

Schiller Residence and Schiller Museum

Schillerstraße 12



It was here on Esplanade that the author of *William Tell* spent his final years. The audio guide introduces you to the poet's life and works and the history of the house. Personal items offer clues on what family life was like in the Schiller household. The highlight is the poet's study, furnished almost entirely with original pieces.
