OPEN 2026

Inspiring, open-minded and accessible: In 2026 the Klassik Stiftung Weimar opens its doors, collections and perspectives to present the city and German culture in a whole new way. Come with us behind the scenes of one of Germany's largest cultural institutions. In the 2026 Theme Year, we invite you to rediscover newly renovated and reopened historic sites, visit exhibitions and events, and use innovative digital tools to acquaint yourselves with our world heritage and take a fresh look at our shared past and present.



The Weimar City Castle – once the seat of ducal power – has awakened with new life and is now an open space for everyone. The renovated east wing of the UNESCO World Heritage Site has been converted into a place of culture, encounter and exchange. With the new permanent exhibition "Weimar Classicism", a visitor information and reception area, and a modern event room, Weimar has regained its central landmark that celebrates its history with an eye to the present day. **Join us in celebrating the reopening of the Castle** from 2 to 4 October 2026! In the summer season, you can take guided tours inside the restored Castle chapel and the

historic Poet Rooms. The Co-Lab will remain a venue of dialogue and community activity on the Castle forecourt but will relocate to the inner Castle courtyard in the near future.

A ceremony on 30 April marks the reopening of another newly renovated UNESCO World Heritage Site of Classical Weimar, the Wittumspalais. The authentic Baroque dowager residence uniquely embodies the living culture around 1800. A new presentation in Duchess Anna Amalia's famous drawing room, entitled **The True Face of Anna Amalia** (30 Apr–13 Sep), offers exclusive insights into the restoration work conducted by the Klassik Stiftung Weimar. It highlights the fascinating back story of the exceptional portrait *Anna Amalia and her sons*. A programmatic impression of decisive moments in the history of Weimar's duchy.

Two UNESCO anniversaries play a central role in the 2026 Theme Year programme. Twenty-five years since Goethe's literary estate was inducted into the UNESCO Memory of the World register, the Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv offers insights into how scholars delve into such a unique cultural treasure and sheds light on its posthumous history. How did Goethe shape his image as an author and statesman during his lifetime? The exhibition **Between Order and Loss** (20 Mar–13 Dec) illustrates the inception of the 'Goethe'

brand based on the poet's diary entries, agenda notes and personal correspondence.

To mark the 30th anniversary of the addition of the Weimar Bauhaus sites to the UNESCO World Heritage List, the Graphic Arts Collection presents the exhibition **Gerhard Marcks. Early Woodcuts by the Bauhaus Master** (21 Aug 26–11 Jan 27), which also features a recently acquired treasure. The exhibition **History Meets the Present** (19 Mar–13 Jul) marks the first time the public can view historic photos and postcards depicting the exceptional UNESCO-recognised Bauhaus buildings from the Dicke Collection.

How does one define a modern library in times of social and media upheaval? An informative presentation entitled **Make it public! The ABCs of the Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek** (30 Apr–30 Oct) at the Study Centre offers new perspectives and workshop insights into the self-image of the Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek as a public forum and democratic institution.

The Goethe Residence is becoming digitally accessible. Virtual tours, interactive applications and immersive formats provide exciting new ways to experience Goethe's life and works. Walk through the rooms with Goethe Live 3D, open drawers in his virtual study using the Goethe Apparatus, and discover fascinating source materials and contexts on the Goethe Era Portal.

This is your chance to (re-)discover this exceptional UNESCO World Heritage site before the poet residence closes for a three-year renovation project on 1 November. A long 'farewell' weekend with events beginning on 30 October will mark a new chapter in the history of the house.

Tip: On Goethe's anniversary, the 28th of August, the Goethe Gartenhaus, Goethe National Museum and "Faust. An Exhibition" in the Schiller Museum are open to all with free admission!

1 Bauhaus Museum Weimar

Stéphane-Hessel-Platz 1



Weimar is the birthplace of the Bauhaus, the internationally renowned school of art and design. The museum is home to the world's oldest Bauhaus collection with an exhibition on its far-reaching historical influence.

2 Erlebnisportal Weimar

This interactive, multimedia installation takes you to seven select destinations highlighting Thuringia's natural and cultural treasures. From the observation platform, you can enjoy a stunning view of the Park on the Ilm, the Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek and the Weimar City Castle.

3 Ducal Vault

Historic cemetery at Poseckscher Garten



This impressive example of Classical architecture in Thuringia is the final resting place of the ducal house of Saxony-Weimar and Eisenach, as well as Germany's most famous poets Johann Wolfgang von Goethe and Friedrich von Schiller.

4 Goethe Gartenhaus

Park on the Ilm



Displayed inside Goethe's first residence in Weimar are original furnishings which the poet had used throughout his life, e.g. the standing desk and stool. Goethe designed the garden himself. The "Stone of Good Luck", one of the first non-figurative monuments in Germany, has stood on the property since 1777.

5 Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv

Jenaer Straße 1



The Goethe- und Schiller-Archiv is Germany's oldest literary archive, home to the written estates of prominent figures dating to the 13th century. Changing exhibitions provide fascinating insights into the collection.

6 Goethe National Museum

Goethe Residence and exhibition "Flood of Life – Storm of Deeds"



The historic residence and garden are the most important sites dedicated to the presentation and study of Goethe's lifelong achievements. The exhibition "Flood of Life – Storm of Deeds" pays tribute to the works and influence of the famous poet, cultural policymaker and art collector.

7 Haus Am Horn

First Bauhaus model house

Am Horn 61



Designed by Georg Muche, the Haus Am Horn is the predecessor of modern living ideas. It was built for the first Bauhaus Exhibition in 1923 and is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A comprehensive media guide provides information about its origin, history of usage and reception.

8 Haus Hohe Pappeln

Belvederer Allee 58 (currently closed for renovation)



The architect and designer Henry van de Velde designed this house for his family. With its lavish living quarters on the bel-étage and adjoining garden, it is an example of a harmonious "total artwork" of the Art Deco period.

9 Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek

Platz der Demokratie 1

Rococo Hall and exhibition "Cranach's Torrent of Images"



In addition to important collections displayed in the three-storey Rococo Hall, the historic library is home to the Book Tower and Military Cabinet. In the authentic setting of the Renaissance Hall, the exhibition "Cranach's Torrent of Images" features items produced by Lucas Cranach and his son.

9a Study Centre

10 Kassengewölbe Mausoleum

Am Jakobskirchhof



Originally used as a quiet place of remembrance, the Kassengewölbe mausoleum itself faded from memory over the years. Reconstructed in 1927, the mausoleum now commemorates Friedrich Schiller's first burial site.

11 Liszt House

Marienstraße 17



On the upper floor of the court gardener's house, Franz Liszt gave piano lessons to many talented German and foreign pianists. Established as a memorial site by Duke Carl Alexander, the living room and workroom with its furnishings and Liszt's Bechstein grand piano has been preserved in its original state.

12 Museum Neues Weimar

Ways to the Bauhaus

Jorge-Semprún-Platz 5



The dawn of a new age: The Museum Neues Weimar takes you back to the age of early modernism around 1900 and the beginnings of the famous Bauhaus movement – from the Weimar Art School to the functional designs of Henry van de Velde.

13 Nietzsche-Archiv

Humboldtstraße 36 (currently closed for renovation)



A jewel of early modernism: After the death of Friedrich Nietzsche, Henry van de Velde redesigned the philosopher's final place of residence. The tour of "Villa Silberblick" sheds light on the reception of Nietzsche's works and the building's eventful history.

14 Park on the Ilm

accessible all year round



The 58-hectare landscape park along the Ilm River is Weimar's natural treasure. Its design was conceived by Duke Carl August and Goethe between 1778 and 1828. Several visual axes created centuries ago offer views of the park's most prominent locations.

15 Park Cave

Through history and climate

Entrance near the Liszt House



The exhibition located beneath the Park on the Ilm takes visitors on a 200,000-year journey through geological and human history. Although the tunnel system was originally used for storing beer, its geological study began with Goethe and his son August.

16 Rebecca Horn – "Concert for Buchenwald"

e-werk Weimar, Straßenbahndepot, Am Kirschberg 4



A historic tram station in the now defunct electricity plant invokes a dark chapter of Weimar's past. The internationally acclaimed installation "Concert for Buchenwald" is one of the most poignant works of contemporary art on the Holocaust in Germany.

17 Roman House

Summer residence of Duke Carl August

Park on the Ilm



Inspired by Italy, Duke Carl August had his friend Goethe supervise the construction of the Roman House, which he later used as a retreat. In addition to its classical architecture and picturesque view of the park, the Roman House contains an exhibition on the park's development.

18 Schiller Residence and Schiller Museum

Schillerstraße 12



Schiller spent his final years here on Esplanade. Let the audio guide introduce you to the poet's life and works and the history of the house. The highlight is Schiller's study, furnished almost entirely with original pieces.

19 Belvedere Castle

Weimar-Belvedere

Belvedere Castle Park accessible all year round



The former ducal summer residence showcases delicate handcrafted artworks of the Baroque era. An interactive model in the west pavilion introduces you to the history of the Castle Park, while the exhibition "Guardians of the Golden Apples" in the gardener's cottage highlights almost 300 years of horticulture at the Orangery.


Tiefurt Mansion Park accessible all year round



Thanks to Duchess Anna Amalia's largesse, this summer residence became an idyllic retreat for Weimar's court society. Today Tiefurt still offers visitors a place to relax. It was here in the park that Goethe performed the world premiere of his ballad "Der Erlkönig" in 1782.

21 Weimar City Castle

Burgplatz 4




The former ducal residence is now the new hub in Weimar's cultural network, featuring the new permanent exhibition "Weimar Classicism", a central information and reception area and a multifunctional event room. Visitors can view the Poet Rooms and Castle chapel on a guided tour. The Co-Lab invites you to participate in a multifaceted programme of activities and events.

The Baroque mansion with its ornate ceiling murals served as Duchess Anna Amalia's dowager residence. Her famous social events took place in the 'Round Table Room'. A highlight is the authentic décor of the Green Salon, the Duchess's former parlour.

In the former stables of Auerstedt Castle, you can view the original carriages used by members of the Ducal and Grand Ducal family of Saxony-Weimar-Eisenach. The collection features several opulent carriages which were gifted to Weimar's court as part of royal dowries.

On the run and using the name "Dr Ritter", Schiller found refuge and accommodation here with the Wolzogen family in 1782. Along with an exhibition of documents from Schiller's life and work, the museum presents an authentic atmosphere of that period with numerous pieces of original furniture.

25 Schloss Kochberg

Im Schlosshof 3, 07407 Großkochberg

Schlosspark Kochberg accessible all year round



The former feudal estate served as a meeting place for Goethe and his close friend Charlotte von Stein. Today it is a museum with original furniture of the Goethe era. A unique highlight is the spacious castle park and the Liebhabertheater, built in 1800, which is still used as a performance venue.

26 Ettersburg Castle Park

Am Schloss 1, 99439 Ettersburg

accessible all year round



Tucked against the north flank of the Ettersberg is a jewel of landscape design – the "Pücklerschlag" – commissioned by Carl Alexander, Anna Amalia's great-grandson. Created in 1845, it offers a stunning panorama with a view of the former Baroque hunting castle.


27 Wieland Estate in Ossmannstedt

Situated northeast of Weimar, the Wieland Estate is the ideal destination for a bike ride. The exhibition "Germany's First Writer" introduces guests to the life and influence of Christoph Martin Wieland, a prominent figure of the Enlightenment, whose gravesite is located in the idyllic park.
